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Building on Faith

Who we are?

We build and renovate simple, decent homes which the working poor can afford to buy. We are an ecumenical Christian organization affiliated with Habitat for Humanity International. We do not “give away” houses. Families who qualify pay back the purchase price over approximately 20- 30 years with no interest.

How are we funded?

We raise money for our revolving fund from individuals, churches, corporations, and other organizations. This money, together with donated material, is used to build homes.

Who gets these homes?

Our family selection committee screens applicants and recommends a family based on need, financial responsibility, inability to obtain conventional home financing, willingness to contribute “sweat equity” and to become a “partner” in habitat.

What is “sweat equity”?

Every family is expected to contribute 250 to 450 hours of their own labor into building their home, or assist in the building of additional homes as a Habitat Partner.

How is a price set on the homes?

How do we know the family will take proper care of the home?

The family has significant investment of their own time in the home, which encourages pride of ownership. Our family support Committee stays in contact with the family throughout their contract. This contact includes insuring that the family is knowledgeable about the responsibilities of home ownership and their partnership with Habitat.

What if the family stops making payments?

Habitat will work with the family through the Family Support Committee to resolve whatever problems: emotional, financial, personal, are preventing them from making the payments. We will always “go the extra mile” with any good faith effort. If all else fails, we will repossess the house and make it available to another family in need.

How can you help?

By contributing your time, money, material or service. Encourage your church, club or business to assist Habitat. Some congregations become “covenant churches” by making Habitat for Humanity part of their annual budget.

Is my contribution tax deductible?

Yes. We are incorporated as a tax exempt, non-profit organization and all contributions are tax deductible.

How is Habitat for Humanity Freeborn/Mower organized?

The annual Meeting elects members to the board of directors. The directors determine policy and appoint members of the various committees: Fund Development, Public Relations, Site selection, Family Selection, Building, and Family Support. The By-Laws assure balance by requiring that no more than 7 of the 13 Directors can be residents of one county; no more than two can be members of one church congregation; and if the president is from one county the vice president must be from the other.
